HAIR: All hair, including hair extensions, braids (touching the shoulders) must be tied up. Hair must be kept away from the eyes. Only white, green, purple, brown or black hair accessories are allowed. No dyed hair or highlights or coloured braids. <i>See accepted hairstyle list on D6 communicator and in classrooms.</i>	

GIRLS
NAILS: Finger nails may not grow beyond the tips of the fingers. No French manicures, “tips” or gel fillings are allowed. Only colourless nail varnish may be worn.
JEWELRY: Earrings: a single pair of gold or silver studs, (4mm) or sleepers (14mm), one in each ear lobe. No fancy gem stone/diamante or coloured studs. No rings, bracelets and other jewellery allowed, except for medical alert bracelet.
MAKE UP: No make-up may be worn!!!
Note: Grade 12 learners may wear formal uniform at any time during the year. They may also wear their own Clan tie or matric tie and white scarfs. The matric pullover can be worn in the place of a blazer.
