SPORT

Results for the season:

Soccer

The soccer teams participate in the Premier League against schools / teams that specialize in sport. Our boys play hard but the results show how tough it is.

The u14 A and B teams have had 2 draws and 6 losses so far.

The under 15A and B teams have collectively lost 3 games, drew 4 and won 3.

The under 17 team has lost all 5 games.

The 1st team has managed 3 draws and 2 losses.



All the teams lost in the quarter final of the cup this year.

On a positive note, the number of players this year compared to last year, has drastically improved. There are 100 boys playing soccer this year, doubling last year's 50.

Netball

The Netball girls have played their debut season in the elite Diamond League.

The junior teams struggled with the pace of the new league and lost all the games.

The u17 girls won one match while the 1st team won 8 and lost 4.



Basketball

The Pretoria Schools Basketball Play-off took place on the 25 and 26 May 2018.

A total of 5 teams made the play-offs this year.

The u15 and u16 boys finished 4th in the league, the u15 and 16 girls finished second. The u19 girls defended their championship by defeating Pretoria Girls High in a nail biting final.

Almighty Banzidi, Karabo Sibeko, Mukoni Mahwasane, Nicole Umutoni and Lynette Ngulube won the Individual All-Stars in their respective age groups.

Mororiseng Mabe, who captained the first team, won the u19 girls Most Valuable Player award making her the best u19 female player in Pretoria.

Hockey

The u16's played 6 matches winning 2, drawing 1 and losing 3.

The first team won 3, drew 1 and lost 2 this season.

Tennis

The tennis team played in a league for the first time this year. We entered 3 teams in the league and had 30 players in total. The junior boys and girls were steady with their results losing 3 matches and winning 3 respectively.

The senior boys showed some spark winning tough games this season. They won 5 out of 6 matches and we are waiting for confirmation that

they may have won their league.
